Example:

A student takes 1 non-lab course and 1 lab course during Summer Session I. The total budget used to determine this student's financial aid eligibility is \$8,428. This figure includes \$5,768 tuition, \$308 books, \$980 room, \$855 board, \$428 personal expenses, and \$89 health fee. The parent contribution for 2008-2009 was \$10,000. Therefore, we take the budget of \$8,428 and subtract $\frac{1}{4}$ of the parent contribution, \$2,500. The remaining amount, \$5,928, is covered with need-based financial aid consisting of Work-Study and grant. (Summer packages will not include loan unless a student has not been awarded their full loan amount – based on Financial Aid Initiative – during the academic year.) Alternative loans are available through the Loan Office to cover the parent contribution during summer terms.
